-If you don't have cotton balls, cut out cloud shapes in cardstock, put that paper with the cutouts over another piece of paper, and have your child color in the cloud shapes  
-Go on a cloud hunt outside and see what shapes you can find.

-Use blueberries and yogurt to create your own snack clouds.

Help your child make the blueberry fall down and then float back up to the clouds.

## **Speech and Language Tips from Alex and Carol**

**Dear families;**

**We hope you enjoy this week's theme around water! A fun activity could be filling up a container of water; bringing out some toy fish, ducks, boats, and frogs, and letting your child wash them, count them, label colors, dunk them "under" the water, etc!**

**Words to focus on: water, wet, sponge, float, sink, wash, clean, soapy, bubbly, shiny, dry, etc.**

**Have fun with this water theme activity!! There are so many verbs (action words) and adjectives (descriptive words) to focus on. You can turn it into a listening game by having your child follow directions (put the big duck in the water, can you wash the blue boat?, etc.).**

**Have a towel handy to dry everything (and everyone) off!
